Philippians 4:4-7 Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say Rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and with thanksgiving let your needs be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

November is the month we give thanks to God for family, for community, for love and kindness and generosity. Let us be mindful of this as we reflect on the past weeks when far too many people are attempting to make sense of their lives after having all they had either flooded away or town away by two back to back major hurricanes.

In his letter to the Philippians, Paul knew that gratitude, even when life is difficult or challenging, can make a positive difference. He encourages us to pray about everything, and to be thankful. It's not that we should gloss over the hard times, or never speak of feeling low. He tells us to bring all of that to God! Paul found, even in prison where he is writing this letter, that looking for things for which to give thanks, even when life isn't going so well, makes a difference. It might be a person, a place, an event, an emotion, something in God's creation, a word spoken at just the right time.

It has been found that writing down five things for which you are grateful, even just once a week, can improve one's well being. People who did this reported less depression, less stress and physical symptoms and felt better about their lives as a whole. (Thank you Robert Emmons!)

As you sit around that Thanksgiving table this year with loved ones, what will you give thanks for? Reflect on where you've seen God in your lives; what are you especially grateful for?

"Gracious God, we give you thanks for all your gifts to us, for your love which sustains us day to day. Help us to see that all the good we have comes ultimately from you. Free us to open our hands and hearts to serve and share with others. Amen"


October Council Meeting Notes: 10-13-2024

As always, if you have questions concerning the finances of Good Shepherd, please give me a call. And, I hope to see you in person or on-line for church.



How YOU Can Help Grow Good Shepherd's Social Media Presence?

It's a good time to remember what you can do on Facebook to help spread the word about what's happening at Good Shepherd!

1.) LIKE AND FOLLOW. Make sure you have "liked" and are "following" Good Shepherd on Facebook! Even if you think you are already good on this step, go check! You might be surprised. By "liking" the page, you are showing support of Good Shepherd, and by "following" the page, you should be getting updates from Good Shepherd in your news feed.

- 2.) **REACT AND COMMENT.** When you see posts from Good Shepherd, "like" them and comment on them! Facebook's algorithm prioritizes posts that generate higher levels of interaction, so the more reactions and comments a post gets, the more the post is likely to show up in people's news feeds (and the higher up in them too). The number of reactions and comments on the church's posts also can be looked at as reflecting how engaged (or not) we are in what's happening at Good Shepherd.
- 3.) **SHARE!** When we want to tell people about Jesus, what do we say we should do? Share the good news! So, if you want to tell people about Good Shepherd, what can you do? Share Good Shepherd's Facebook posts! A post promoting an upcoming worship service or event? Share it to invite your friends! A post with pictures from a church gathering or activity? Share it to show your friends the good time you had at Good Shepherd or what we're doing for the community! The more shares our posts get, the more people they can reach, and the more our social media presence grows.
